# 5. **SCREENAGERS** – update from Lorelei Saito:

- Screenagers is documentary about the challenges of navigating social media, video games and academics. Offers solutions and tips for families on how to navigate online world and be good digital consumers

# 6. MAY FAIR

- a. Great school community family day traditionally held in May. In the past, each grade level would perform in the courtyard, with bento lunch and kiddle games to follow.
- b. Due to COVID, we haven't been able to have May Fair the past few years.
- c. Mr. Gusman: will discuss with Ms. Chang (one of 5 teacher liaisons for the event) about possible options this year.
- d. Dani: PTA to discuss in the next couple of weeks what the PTA can do to help support May Fair. Important since this is an internal school event (compared to craft fair that is broader community-based event).
- e. Looking for parent volunteer since we don't have a committee chair yet.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. **READ-A-THON** Stanford working on proposal to be submitted to Mr. Gusman
  - a. In the spirit of giving back to Noelani students, Stanford is looking a Read-a-Thon program kids to read and keep track of minutes read/books and will earn prizes that are sponored by the PTA; NOT a fundraiser. Program to encourage kids' reading.
  - b. More details to be provided at a later date.

- 2. Request for Benches Mr. Gusman is requesting that the PTA help pay for benches to be placed along path going to A building (where plants don't grow well) – benches that can be used for kids to sit on before school. Looking at possible types of benches.
- 3. New Playground to be Provided by the DOE Senator Taniguichi helped secure funds for a new playground to be located on B building and refurbish existing playground. Hopefully this will get done this school year.
- 4. New Cafeteria Curtain Stanford noted for parents who don't go into the cafeteria installed a few weeks ago and it looks great!
- 5. Noelani PTA Banners Put Up one by the office and the second on the fence near exit way for PTA to communicate with Noelani community. Thanks to Ms. Nakamura for printing out and Mr. Richard (custodian) to help put messages up on banner.
